10 Tips on Winning a Scholarship

1. Start searching for scholarships as soon as possible. Don't wait until spring of your senior year in high school to start searching, or you'll miss half the deadlines. Continue searching for scholarships even after you are enrolled in college. Consider this like a full time job.
2. Answer all of the optional questions on a scholarship matching web site for about twice as many matches.
3. Use a free scholarship matching service like Fastweb.com. The Fastweb database is updated daily, and the site will email you notifications of new scholarships that match your personal background profile.
4. Look for local scholarships on bulletin boards near the guidance counselor of financial aid offices, or the library's jobs and careers section.
5. Apply to every scholarship for which you are eligible. Pursue less competitive scholarships, such as small awards and essay contests, since they are easier to win and the money adds up and helps you win bigger scholarships.
6. Don't miss deadlines. Use a calendar and checklist to get organized.
7. Tailor your application to the sponsor's goals. Read and follow the instructions carefully.
8. If you have difficulty writing essays, try recording yourself as you answer the question out loud, and transcribe the recording later. Most people can think and speak faster than they can write or type. Create an outline afterward to organize your thoughts.
9. Personalize your essay and be passionate. Write about something of interest to you. Make your application stand out from the crowd. Talk about your impact on other people. Give examples and be specific.
10. Google your name and make sure you have a professional online profile. Use a professional email address, such as firstname.lastname@gmail.com. Clean up the content of your Facebook account, removing inappropriate and immature material.

AFSCME Family Scholarship

This is for graduating high school seniors only Any graduating high school senior who is a daughter or son of an AFSCME member, (or whose legal guardian or financially responsible grandparent is an AFSCME member) and who intends to enroll in a full-time, four year degree program in any accredited college or university, is eligible to apply for a scholarship. \$2000 each year for a max of four years

To be eligible, you must:

- Be a graduating high school senior whose parent, legal guardian or financially responsible grandparent is a full dues-paying AFSCME member;
- At the time the scholarship is awarded, be enrolled in a full-time degree program either at an accredited four-year institution or at a two-year institution that will transfer credits to a four-year institution; and
- Have taken the SAT or the ACT

American Academy of Neurology

Awards

All entries will be reviewed by a panel of physicians and scientists who are actively engaged in neuroscience research at academic institutions throughout the US. Four prize winners will be selected through two rounds of competition.

Four winners will each receive a \$1,000 prize. Three winners and their teachers will receive airfare, two nights hotel, \$100 per day for expenses (up to two days), and the opportunity to present their work during a scientific poster session at the AAN 66th Annual Meeting in Philadelphia, PA—the world's largest gathering of neurologists. One winner and his/her teacher will receive airfare, three nights hotel, a daily per diem (up to three days), and the opportunity to present his/her work at the Child Neurology Society 43rd Annual Meeting in Columbus, OH.

Eligibility

- Students must be enrolled in secondary school (grades 9-12) in the United States, regardless of age

American Fire Extinguisher Scholarship Program

The AFSA Scholarship Contest is open to high school seniors in the United States who plan to further their education at a college/university or certified trade school in the United States. The scholarship is not based on financial need. Relatives of AFSA staff or board members may not enter. You must be a high school senior during the 2017-2018 school year who will attend a college/university or trade school in the United States starting with the fall 2018 semester.

Applicant Eligibility Requirements

- The High School Senior College Scholarship Contest is open to **high school seniors** who are citizens or aliens legally residing in the USA.
- Scholarship funds are payable to the winner's college/university or certified trade school in the United States; winner must enroll for classes beginning no later than **Fall 2018 session**.
- Winner selection is **NOT based on financial need, GPA or demographic** criteria.
- **Home-schooled students may apply** as long as course of study is equivalent to that of a senior in high school.
- Relatives of AFSA staff or NATIONAL board members may not enter.

Entry Details

1. Scholarship entries are **ONLY accepted online** through the AFSA scholarship web site (www.afsascholarship.org).
2. **Entrants must submit a completed entry form with all required information.** Before college scholarship funds will be awarded, all information submitted on the entry form by the entrant will be verified. If ANY false or misleading information is submitted on the entry form, the student will be disqualified without notification to the entrant.
3. **Each entrant is allowed only ONE (1) ENTRY submittal.** Any attempt to enter again under a different name, address, etc., will automatically disqualify the entrant without notification to the entrant.
4. Entrants selected as winners are required to submit the name and contact information of their chosen college/university/certified trade school* for verification of registration and payment of the scholarship to the school. All forms and processes must be completed within sixty (60) days of contest end date or your scholarship is forfeited.

REQUIREMENTS

Be a U.S. citizen
Be between the ages of 17 and 26
Have a high school GPA of at least 2.50
Have a high school diploma or equivalent
Score a minimum of 920 on the SAT (math/verbal) or 19 on the ACT (excluding the required writing test scores)
Meet physical standards
Agree to accept a commission and serve in the Army on Active Duty or in a Reserve Component (Army Reserve or Army National Guard)

YOUR COMMITMENT

An eight-year service commitment with the Army.
Serve full time in the Army for four years and four years with the Individual Ready Reserve (IRR).
Selected Cadets may choose to serve part time in the Army Reserve or Army National Guard while pursuing a civilian career

An emailed notice or a current class schedule that shows your GPA are acceptable formats to submit. You may save an emailed notice as a screenshot (JPG) or as a PDF file.
- **Honors and Activities List** — Please upload a list of honors, clubs, social activities, employment, volunteer experiences, talents, and interests. Resumes are accepted.
- **Transcripts** — Please be prepared to upload your most recent transcripts from high school and/or any colleges attended. If you are currently attending Flagler-Tallahassee, FAMU, FGCU, FSU, SFC, TCC, or UF, only your college transcripts are required. You must upload your most recent official transcript which includes your cumulative GPA. A screen shot of your unofficial transcript is permitted. * A 675 GED score is the equivalent of a 3.0 GPA.
- **Essay** — In an essay of 500-750 words, please be prepared to respond to all of the topics below:
 1. Write a brief autobiography, which includes your characteristics and general outlook on life.
 2. Select the most significant event in your life and discuss how it affected you.
 3. Briefly discuss your professional goals and how you hope to achieve them.
 4. Tell us why you would make a good candidate for our community living program.
- **Financial Information** — All applicants must demonstrate financial need by filing for the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA). After processing, you must upload a copy of the Student Aid Report (SAR), Part 1, pages 1-7, to the Southern Scholarship Foundation office. SSF uses the SAR to determine financial need. An Estimated Family Contribution (EFC) of 07500 (\$7,500) is typically the maximum allowed at SSF. However, if your EFC exceeds 07500 and you have extenuating circumstances, please include a "Financial Need" statement and explanation as well as the previous year's tax return from your parent/guardian. You may still qualify for the scholarship.
